Are you missing getting together physically with fellow club members? We are excited to announce that Cupertino Coin Club will be holding our annual club banquet this year, our 36th banquet in our 50th year as a club, and you and guest(s) are invited on Sunday, September 20, 2020 from 5:00 - 9:00 pm! The Blue Pheasant is currently closed. We found a lovely Italian restaurant called Palermo which has four separate outdoor patios, delicious food, and ambiance while overlooking Los Gatos Creek. We have

reserved a private, shaded patio all to ourselves. The restaurant is centrally located in San Jose with easy access from the freeway. All pandemic safety precautions will be made by the restaurant as mandated by the County of Santa Clara. Tables of six will be safely spaced apart from one another per County Orders. Servers will be wearing face coverings and gloves. Guests, except the very young or those for whom it is medically inadvisable, must wear face coverings at all times except while eating or drinking. Four complete meal choices of Lasagne Meat Sauce, Chicken Parmigiana, Grilled Wild Salmon, or Veal Piccata are being offered. Each dinner includes a fresh green garden salad, bread & butter, coffee or tea, and a house-made dessert. Cupertino Coin Club is subsidizing \$10 of each meal, bringing the restaurant's prices down from \$39 and \$45. Your prices will be \$29 for Lasagna, Chicken, or Salmon, and \$35 for Veal. These prices are inclusive of all taxes and gratuities. Attendees will receive an exclusive free 2020 Banquet Chip for the first 48 people who sign up or a free Club Medal after the initial 48. Can You Solve the Dark Coin Riddle?

You've heard the traveler's tales. You followed the crumbling maps and now, after a long and dangerous quest, you have some good news and some bad news. The good news is that you managed to locate the legendary dungeon containing the stash of ancient Scythian coins and the eccentric wizard who owns the castle and even generously agreed to let you have them. The bad news is that he is not quite as generous about letting you leave the dungeon unless you solve his puzzle. The task sounds simple enough. Both faces of the coin bear the fearsome scorpion crest. One in silver; one in gold. And all you have to do is separate them into two piles so that each has the same number of coins facing silver side up. You're about to begin when all of the torches suddenly blow out and you're left in total darkness. There are hundreds of coins in front of you and each one feels the same on both sides. You try to remember where the silver-facing coins were, but it's hopeless. You've lost track, but you do know one thing for certain. When there was still light, you counted exactly 20 silver-side-up coins in the pile. What can you do? Are you doomed to remain in the dungeon with your new-found treasure forever? You're tempted to kick the pile of coins and curse the curiosity that brought you here. But at the last moment, you stop yourself. You just realized, there's a surprisingly easy solution. What is it? Recap:

- There are hundreds of coins in the pile.
- At the beginning, there are exactly 20 coins facing silver side up.
- You must divide the coins into two piles. Each pile can have any number of silver coins, so long as there are an equal number of silver coins in each pile.
- Each pile can contain any number of coins greater than zero. The two piles don't have to be equal in size.
- There is no way to tell which side of any particular coin is facing up.
- Flipping coins is allowed. Resting coins on their sides is not.
