Let's face it, without revenue from our annual coin shows for the past three years, the club finances have been hit very hard. We still have monthly expenses, just not enough income to cover. We also used to generate income from drawing ticket sales at large CoinExpo shows twice a year. Those shows have dwindled in size to the point where we cannot sell enough tickets to cover the cost of the prizes we offer. Historically, we have also generated income from the sale of drawing tickets at our monthly meetings. We can only hold those drawings if the revenue from the sale of tickets exceeds the cost of the prizes. This did occur in June but not in July, so the July drawing was canceled. We are running an annual deficit that we cannot sustain for more than four years. Annual club dues alone are not sufficient to cover all of our costs. To keep the club solvent, we need your help. Think of this as your ticket to declutter your home of useful, excellent-condition items that are just taking up space. Have you been given gifts in the past that you have no intention of using? Those are the types of items we are suggesting you offer up to the club for our Fundraising/ Donation Auction to be held instead of our regular auction at our December 9 General Meeting. The types of items we are looking for are: wine, liquor, small housewares (ie. baking dishes, small appliances), tools, numismatic items such as supplies or books, etc. We can't take large items, furniture, clothing, etc. The key to the success of this endeavor is the variety and guality of the items donated, and our preparation in collecting items, pricing, and getting them ready for the auction. Members, this is your club. You have a vested interest in helping keep it viable. This excellent idea was suggested by Michael Turrini. It sounded more palatable than charging actual costs for club events and activities. Imagine dues being \$25 per year or a banquet dinner costing \$60 per person.
