Club President Fred D. called our meeting to order at 7:32 PM. Fred welcomed everyone. There were seven board members and no quests present.

Recording Secretary Lyle Okamoto reported nothing new.

Corresponding Secretary Al Lo received the usual mail plus four bourse applications. Al noted that Don P. was no longer in Minnesota. Al also received a change-of-address from Don B..

Historian Harold W. reported nothing new.

Gary said that a copper medal looked nicer and were

usually scarcer than a silver medal. **Gary** said that the real prize was getting one's initials on the medal. The motion passed with **Lyle Okamoto** objecting. This motion will take effect for our 2014 medal.

Old Business: Martha and Fred D. and Al Lo gave coin presentations at the Eton School Enrichment Day. There were three fourth-grade classes and one third-grade class. Al passed out nickels to the students. When Al pulled out an Ike dollar, no one knew what it was.

Martha D. suggested changing the prize structure by eliminating one tenth-ounce gold Eagle and replace it with two Mexican gold 2-pesos and more silver Eagles. Martha liked that most of the dealers were still set up until the end of the show, and she told Scott this. A discussion about Scott G.'s shows ensued.
