At the November meeting Corresponding Secretary Al Lo gave a talk on Australian Lunar Coins. Al started by saying that the Chinese Pandas were the first silver rounds to be introduced followed by the American Eagles and then the Canadian Maple Leaf. He recommended that if you want a silver round where the design changes every year, then you should go for the Australian Lunar Coin because the design will only repeat every twelve years. They come in half, one, two, five, and ten ounces, plus one kilo weights in either BU or colored. Al then announced what animal corresponds to what birth year and asked everyone to raise their hand when their animal was said. He gave us all the aspects of each animal. (I somewhat fit the rabbit that I am.) Al suggested finding these coins at shows or on ebay because buynig direct from the Australian Mint is too expensive due to shipping. From shows and ebay the cost is just a bit above bullion. Thanks again Al!
