- Recording Secretary Lyle
 Okamoto arrived late at about
 8 p.m. There were seven board members and one guest present.

The Mark Twain Commemorative Coin

Born Samuel Langhorne Clemens in 1835, Mark Twain became known when "The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County" was published in 1865. 28 books as well as more short stories followed. His stories dealt with the social situations that Americans had at that time.

The coin program includes both a gold coin and a silver coin. The gold coin is a \$5 coin that comes in uncirculated or proof with a "W" mint mark.

The mintage limit is 100,000. The obverse features a portrait of Mark Twain and the reverse features a

steamboat on the Mississippi River where Mark Twain worked from about 1858 to 1861.

The silver coin is a one dollar coin and also comes in uncirculated and proof with a "P" mint mark. The mintage limit is 350,000. The obverse features Mark Twain smoking a pipe with the smoke creating a picture of Huckleberry Finn and Jim on their raft. The reverse features characters from Twain's works including *Huckleberry Finn*, "The Celebrated Jumping Frog of Calaveras County", and *A Connecticut Yankee in King Arthur's Court*. All coins come with a certificate of authenticity.

A surcharge from each coin will be paid to the Mark Twain House & Museum in Hartford, CT; UC Berkeley; Elmira College, NY; and the Mark Twain Boyhood Home & Museum in Hannibal, MO. -info from usmint.gov and www.cmgww.com/historic/twain/about/bio.htm
