Gary has served as Vice President, Treasurer, Corresponding Secretary, and various committee chairmanships in the Cupertino Coin Club. He was an educational guest speaker at many monthly meetings and gave many informative Show & Tell presentations, He has also designed many annual show medals and been an exhibiter at shows, winning many Best in Show Awards.

Gary is a Life Member of the San Jose Coin Club. As a member of the club, he has served in many officer positions such as: Corresponding Secretary, Board Member and various committee chairmanships. Gary has also served the club by being an educational guest speaker at monthly meetings, by giving informative Show & Tell presentations, and by helping with its annual show as the Show Exhibit Trophy Chair, Front Desk co-chair, and Raffle Tickets and Medals Chair. He has also designed many annual show medals and been an exhibiter at shows, winning many Best in Show Awards. Gary always volunteered and worked tirelessly during show set up, at the show, and at show clean up

Gary is one of only 31 members in the club's 73 years history to receive its highest honor, membership in the San Jose Coin Club's Hall of Fame.

Gary is also an active member and participant at the Fremont Coin Club.

Gary is very involved in exonumia. His specialties include coin club medals and tokens, casino chips, and casino silver strikes. He is always willing to share his knowledge through personal conversations, giving educational club speeches, and entering exhibits in local shows.

Regretfully, his longtime friend and fellow sojourner in organized numismatics, 'Al' Lo was to learn of his sudden passing.

My last time conversing with Gary was during the October 2019 Annual Awards Banquet of the Cupertino (California) Coin Club. He came walking very slowly with pain in his legs and back; yet, he came to enjoy the Banquet plus had everything ready for attendees. As usual, those of present received our special 'Banquet Chip'. He smiled and sat among his friends. He and I exchanged chuckles with our perennial commentary of dislikes and likes in our hobby. Little did I anticipate a tragic passing.

Over the decades, Gary was a consummate numismatic exhibitor, earning many awards. He, in addition, had a lengthy record of service and devotion, having joined in April 1971, to the Cupertino Coin Club, particularly dedicated many years as its Treasurer. Among his other services was his support to 'youth numismatics'.

His smile, his 'I told you so', his always among the first at a monthly Cupertino Coin Club meeting, plus also always holding the same parking space at the Club's meeting venue shall be missed. However, we, and our hobby, have been enriched and enlightened while Gary was here. We are forged to continue as Gary would hope.

Words and thoughts are always difficult at the passing of someone that you have known or anyone for that matter. But, I close with these words from a source undocumented and which shall speak from our hearts: "Those We Love Do Not Go Away; They Walk Beside Us Every Day: Unseen, Unheard, But Always Near, Still Loved.
