The Blue Ridge Parkway- The Newest ATB Quarter

I received an e-mail from the US Mint advertising the latest ATB Quarter release, and it featured the Blue Ridge Parkway in North Carolina. I wondered what was so



interesting about a road that merited it being included on an ATB Quarter so I decided to do some research. Construction started as a project during the Great Depression to put people to work. Even though the parkway was established in 1936, the last section was not completed until 1987. The parkway stretches from North Carolina to Virginia along the top of the Blue Ridge Mountains which is part of the eastern Appalachian Mountains. The length of the parkway is 469 miles long with the highest point being 6053 feet on Richland Balsam Mountain.

The Parkway is in one of the most ecologically diverse areas in the world. Numerous varieties of plants and trees grow there, and many species of birds and animals live there including bears and beavers. People can simply drive along the parkway and enjoy the spectacular views or they can participate in many of the recreation activities such as canoeing and kayaking, camping, hiking, and ranger-led campfire talks. -info from nps.gov/blri
