There also is included an engraved representation of the Buzz Aldrin on the Moon photo with the reflection of Neil Armstrong, the US flag, and the lunar lander in Aldrin's visor. The mintage limit for this product is 6000 with a product limit of 5700 and a household order limit of 10.
