Get Your Auction Items In!

A very popular part of our club meetings is the auction where members are allowed to put their items in to be sold to the highest bidder. There has been an issue though where people are putting their auction items out too late or not putting their lots

in the correct order. In light of this, we are asking that everyone gets their auction lots on the table at least ten minutes before the start of the meeting. This will give the auctioneer and the treasurer enough time to make sure all the forms are gathered and organized.

Also, please make sure you are keeping the lots in order as they were placed on the table and don't cut the line that was established. For example, if there are already five lots on the table when you go to place yours, do not put yours in between lots two and three. Place it as lot #6. This keeps the queue fairly ordered by arrival and also helps the auctioneer to keep the auction slips organized.
