The Boot Memorial

Today I was looking at a Saratoga National Historical Park quarter, one of last year's America the Beautiful Quarters. It depicts a hand giving another hand a sword with the words "British Surrender 1777". British General John Burgoyne did surrender there in October of 1777 after the Battles of Saratoga which many consider to be the turning point of the American Revolution. The quarter offers a fitting tribute to this event, and I bet no one ever even considered depicting the Boot Memorial on the quarter instead.

I learned of the Boot Memorial in a book I read last year called The Notorious Benedict Arnold by Steve Sheinkin. I read it because I wanted to know what drove Arnold to treason. The Boot Memorial commemorates Major General Benedict Arnold's leadership and bravery during the second battle. He led his soldiers in capturing Breymann's Redoubt which left the British Army exposed. In his charge, Arnold was shot in the leg. His horse was killed and when it collapsed, it fell on Arnold's already-shot leg, breaking it and causing further injury. Arnold had to be carried from the battlefield and spent five months in recovery. He was promoted to General but still felt slighted and unappreciated. This led him to conspire to hand over West Point to the British. West Point was a strategic fort on the Hudson River and having it in the hands of the British may have caused the end of the Revolution. Arnold's plot was discovered when his contact, Major John Andre, was captured. Arnold eventually moved to England where no one really cared about his existence and he died in the early 1800s.

The Boot Memorial is an upright stone slab with a stone boot on the front. The back has an inscription which reads: "Erected 1887 By JOHN WATTS de PEYSTER Brev: Maj: Gen: S.N.Y. 2nd V. Pres't Saratoga Mon't Ass't'n: In memory of the "most brilliant soldier" of the Continental Army who was desperately wounded on this spot the sally port of BORGOYNES GREAT WESTERN REDOUBT 7th October, 1777 winning for his countrymen the decisive battle of the American Revolution and for himself the rank of Major General". Arnold isn't even named on his own memorial.
