It's that time of year again. Dues for the 2022-2023 year are due on or before April 1, 2022 for your continued membership. Dues were last updated in January 2000 to \$5 for adults. Now almost 22 years later during the December CCC Board Meeting, the directors decided it is time to increase our annual dues. For adults, it is now \$12 per year (or \$1 per month average), and for youth, it is now \$6 per year (or 50 cents per month average). The new dues rate was effective as of the December board meeting.
