

• Club President Emile M. called our meeting to order at 7:35 p.m. Emile welcomed everyone to our October meeting. There were eight board officers and no guests present.

Recording Secretary Lyle Okamoto reported nothing new.
Corresponding Secretary Al Lo reported receiving several banquet reservations, medal orders, and the usual club newsletters. Al mailed banquet invitations to club life-members Ray N. and Julia Bu.

• Treasurer Gary gave the Treasurer's Report. All is well.

• Historian Harold W. reported nothing new.

• Curator Gary reported nothing new.

• Program Chair Greg J. reported that November will feature Don Bu. speaking on "Family Members on Coins." Greg will bring soft drinks to our meeting.

• Membership Chair Al Lo received no new membership applications.

• Coin Press Editor Allison Paker reported nothing new. Gary mentioned that he will buy about \$100 face value in discounted postage for 75% of face to use on our newsletter.

• Webmaster Steve Kooij reported that our website still was not coming up. Our website fee was auto-renewed for two years on Kenneth Ni.'s credit card. Our renewal date is October 17 and the charge was put through on October 12.

• Youth Advisor Gary reported five youths participated in our Youth Drawing. Everyone was happy.

• Banquet Chair Gary reported that 37 people have signed-up so far for our CCC 30th Annual Awards Banquet, scheduled for Sunday, October 19, 2014. The location is the Blue Pheasant Restaurant. Jill, our usual server, will not be there. Jill assured us that the replacement server will be well-trained.

• Nominating Chair Al Lo said it was still too early.

• Medals Chair Gary reported that over half of 2014 CCC silver medals have sold. Our 2014 CCC silver medals are \$26 each. Gary encouraged everyone to check out books of tickets to sell.

• Old Business: a) Greg J. reported that the KMVT-TV episode of "The Better Part," that was recorded last month, was reviewed on Tuesday. There were some typos in the credits, but that would be easy to correct. Everyone at the studio loved it. The episode will be ready soon.

b) Al Lo checked out various venues to hold our monthly meetings. The two best were St. Joseph of Cupertino Catholic Church, Community Center Building, 10110 North De Anza Boulevard, Cupertino; and Union Church, 20900 Stevens Creek Boulevard near Stelling Road, Cupertino. St. Joseph has a 35'X35' room with kitchen for a \$50 per month donation. Union Church has a room that is about the same size as our current hall for \$75 per month.
