#### **Dues are Due!**



## Block Island National Wildlife Refuge

The last quarter for 2018 and the 45th quarter in the America the Beautiful Series is the Block Island National Wildlife Refuge quarter from Rhode Island. The island sits 12 miles off the southern coast of Rhode Island and was



The refuge is a critical migratory bird stopover for such birds as the piping plover. The fruit bearing plants there provide essential food for all the birds that come there. The island is known internationally for its spectacular birdwatching.
