- Banquet: Suzanne Tr. reports all members are invited. We still need volunteers to help set up, clean up and cook assistant. Discussed about details related to the Banquet.
- Nominating Chair Emile M. reports Nominating Committee to begin convening in November.
- Medals Chair Emile M. reports medal designs have been sent to the BEX.

Discussion ensued re: youth Life Members whose grandparents signed them up at a very young age and never participated in any club meetings or events.
