### Recap of our Wednesday, September 19, 2012 Board Meeting

Board Members (5): Martha D., Steve K., Stephen L., Allison P., and Howard W. Club President Fred D. called our meeting to order at 7:34 PM. Fred welcomed everyone. There were twelve board members and no guests present. Gary gave Allison P. a copy of our medals order form for our newsletter and general distribution. Recording Secretary Lyle Okamoto reported nothing new. Corresponding Secretary Al Lo received the usual mail. Treasurer Gary gave the Treasurer's Report. All is well. A discussion about \$20 for Santa Clara Expo badges ensued. We made about \$700 on the Santa Clara Expo club drawing. Historian Harold W. added unused Ticket #1970 from the Santa Clara Expo club drawing to our archives. Curator Gary reported nothing new. Program Chair Emile M. reported that our October meeting will be Youth Night. Junior President Brennan L. tried out the mighty club gavel. President Fred D. went over Youth Night activities with Brennan. Fred favored having our Beauty and the Beast Contest on Youth Night. Al Lo moved to have our Beauty and the Beast Contest at our next meeting. Emile asked for guest speakers at our future meetings. Allison P. was encouraged to speak. Allison will need a Power Point projector and extension cord. We may prevail upon Herb D. to loan his projector for the presentation. Membership Chair Al Lo reported that there were three new applications for membership, two youths and one adult. Al moved to accept the two youth applications from Jonathan S. (age 14) and Rosemary T. (age 10), and the one adult application from Bob B. Martha D. seconded. The motion passed unanimously. Coin Press Editor Allison P. reported that she was working on a new masthead for our newsletter. Co-Web Master Steve K. will email Ray N. about our club web site. Youth Advisor Gary reported that six youths participated in our Youth Drawing at our September 2012 general meeting. The kids were happy. Treasurer Gary mailed the bill to Sally J., Treasurer of San Jose Coin Club, for our CCC/SJCC Annual Joint Picnic. We have not yet received a response. Banquet Chair Gary announced that our CCC 28th Annual Awards Banquet will be held on Sunday, October 21, 2012, at the Blue Pheasant Restaurant, 22100 Stevens Creek Boulevard, Cupertino. Social hour begins at 5 PM, and we eat at 6 PM. The cost will be \$25 per person (our club defrays \$10 of the \$35 cost). Reservations are due by our next board meeting on Wednesday, October 17, 2012. Fred D. hoped that we will have our regular server. Gary asked for our regular server. Nominating Chair Al Lo noted that it was still too soon to have nominations. Medals Chair Gary has our club medals. The prices are \$38 for each silver medal, and \$7 for each bronze medal with two show drawing tickets. Old Business: Al Lo found two 20% discount cards for Togo's on the counter at Togo's. Al used one card to get us a \$43 discount on Togo's for our SeptemberFest. The second discount card is good through December. Togo's sandwiches for our Christmas Party was suggested. Treasurer Gary said no, Program Chair Emile M. liked the idea. Katherine R. brought macaroni and potato salads to our SeptemberFest. The macaroni salad was a bit different because they were out of the usual style. Alice and Tom K. brought eqg rolls, and Ron Ishizaki brought cantaloupe to our SeptemberFest. New Business: Martha D. suggested that we replace the one-tenth ounce gold Eagle with two 2-pesos gold and two additional silver Eagles for future show drawing prizes. This would

bring the total number of drawing prizes to fifteen. At Santa Clara Expo, we ordered 2000
tickets and only had 158 unsold tickets, with one ticket going to our club curator collection.
Fred D. received an email from Eton School about their Enrichment Day on November 15,
2012. Fred said there would be four sessions, with none younger than fourth grade plus some

fifth graders. **Fred** said not to use slabbed coins for the presentations because slabbed coins do not project well. Last time, **Fred** and **Keith S**. could not get into the room before the first session and wasted valuable time setting up. Coin packets were brought to the teacher, but **Fred** was disappointed that the teacher did not give out the coins until lunch. **Fred** was ready for questions, but there were no questions because the kids did not have the coins to look at. **Fred** said that there were very few questions during the sessions.

Al Lo said that he would help with the Eton School Enrichment Day if it is not on a Monday, Wednesday, or Friday. Keith S. brought an ancient coin book last time, but there was little interest from the kids. Fred said that it needs to be current coins to keep the kids' attention. Allison P. advised not to go below the fourth grade for the presentations.

Judy C. donated a U.S. Proof Set Capital Plastics holder to our club at the Santa Clara Expo. Judy just walked up to our club table and said that she would like to make a donation to our club. Fred asked what should we do with the holder. Auctioning it as a club donation was recommended.

Show Business: At Santa Clara Expo, **Fred D**. and **Al Lo** both received free badges on Thursday from **Scott G**. **Al** thanked everyone who helped at our club table. **Fred** asked if we should continue using Minuteman Press in Fremont to print our tickets. **Gary** said that it would be easier in the future because they already have our format. **Lyle Okamoto** pondered if **Scott G**. would mind if we put advertising on the backs of the tickets. We could put our CCC Show ads and/or **Scott's** future show ads on the backs.

For our Cupertino Coin Club 41st Annual Coin Show on Sunday, February 17, 2012, **Al Lo** went over the list of show jobs. A discussion about the effectiveness of show postcards ensued. **Al** requested that table covers be purchased if anyone finds them on sale. The Party Store sometimes have table covers on sale for \$1 (marked down from \$1.99). **Gary** said that **Mr**. **Michael S. Turrini** would do the Youth Table at our CCC Show. We will need a covered pickup truck to transport show supplies. We could impose upon **Rich M**. for help.

**Gary** motioned to adjourn. **Martha** D. seconded. Everyone said "Goodnight". Our meeting adjourned at 8:42 PM.
