Our 50th Anniversary Chip

At the end of 2019, Fred D. tried very hard to have the club make a commemorative for the club's 50th Anniversary. The board decided that a medal was not feasible. Life member Al Lo proposed that a large ceramic chip be made that was similar to the club's annual banquet chip but larger. Al's proposal was accepted. Life members Fred D. and Al Lo designed and created the special attractive red commemorative chip.



One side shows Cuperino Coin Club and its logo along with the 50th anniversary years: 1970-2020. The other side highlights the anniversary meeting: April 10, 2020 at St. Joseph of Cupertino and with the number 50 surrounded by 50 stars in the center. This chip is 46mm ($^{\sim}1$ 7/8") and larger than the 39mm (1.5") banquet chip. These chips were to be given to members at the 50th Anniversary Celebration on April 10, 2020.

Al contacted the producer of our banquet chip, and he and Fred worked closely with their representative to modify the design and enhance the final design. Edge lettering was added to the design. Three hundred chips were produced. Distribution would be as follows:

- Give a free chip to each eligible member. Chip will be given at club meetings.
- Charge \$1 per chip shipping & handling if a member wants a chip mailed to them.
- Sell to members additional chips for \$2 per chip plus \$1 per chip shipping and handling with 2 chips maximum.
- Sell chips to non-members for \$4 per chip with \$1 per chip shipping and handling

Due to COVID, the April 10, 2020 50th Anniversary Celebration was postponed. Zoom meetings replaced in-person meetings. In-person meetings with food were finally allowed, and the 50th Anniversary Celebration was held during the annual SeptemberFest meeting on September 9, 2022-almost 2.5 years late. Happy to finally celebrate the 50th anniversary, Al Lo made a special anniversary package. In addition to the anniversary chip, Al donated 1989 and 1990 Good for 25¢ wooden nickels to make a 3-piece souvenir set. Forty-five of these special anniversary souvenirs were made and given. There were 52 members and guests at the meeting and 4 more on Zoom. Some attendees received a 2-piece souvenir with only the anniversary chip and a 1989 wooden nickel. Paid up members should see Membership Chair Al Lo for their free chip or send \$1 per chip to PO Box 448, Cupertino, CA 95015 and request to have their chip mailed.
