The Mint's First Palladium Proof!

On September 6, the US Mint will release its first ever palladium proof coin. The coin is called the 2018 American Eagle One Ounce Palladium Proof Coin. It will have a "W" mint mark and be limited to a mintage of 15,000. Each coin will contain one ounce of .9995 palladium.

The obverse looks just like the Mercury dime with the design of winged Liberty. It was designed by Adolph A. Weinman and bears the inscriptions "LIBERTY", "IN GOD WE TRUST", and the year 2018.



The reverse was also designed by Adolph A. Weinman and features a high-relief version of the 1907 American Institute of Architects Gold Medal. The design is that of an eagle and a branch with the inscriptions "UNITED STATES OF AMERCA", "\$25", "1 OZ. Pd .9995 FINE," and "E PLURIBUS UNUM".
