Everyone loves the thrill of discovering a treasured piece at a great price. Our club auctions are a fantastic opportunity for members to find new additions for their collections, and they have long been a cornerstone of the coin club experience.

Since its founding, Cupertino Coin Club has worked to foster interest and growth in the numismatic hobby—especially among young collectors. We have hosted educational programs in local elementary schools, offered the Coin Collecting Merit Badge Workshop for Scouting America, and participated in events like Scout-O-Rama to introduce youth to our shared passion. One of the highlights of our calendar is Youth Night, where the Junior President runs the general meeting and the evening's speaker topic is geared specifically toward younger members. A cherished tradition in our club has been an unspoken agreement: when a youth member bids on an auction item, adult members will usually refrain from bidding against them. When a youth member bids on an auction item, please use discretion when continuing to bid. If a youth member is interested in an item, maybe let them have the chance at winning. This simple gesture recognizes that most young collectors often rely on modest allowances, while adult members typically have more disposable income.

To build on this spirit, we are excited to introduce a new class of auction items. Starting with the July meeting, we ask members submitting items for our monthly auction to consider including a few "youth-only" items—

lots that are reserved exclusively for bidding by junior members. Of course, members are welcome to submit general auction items as well, but we continue to encourage adult members to use discretion in determining if they should yield to youth bids for those youth starting to build their own collections, whenever possible.

Our hope is that this new step will inspire even more participation from our young numismatists, helping them grow their collections, deepen their knowledge, and cultivate a lifelong appreciation for coin collecting.

Submit Your Medal Design for 2026!

Our August general meeting will feature the medal design contest for our 2026 medal. If you want to submit a design, please read the rules below:

- Members in good standing are eligible (all dues paid and current).
- The design must be on unlined paper in a circle of six to eight inches in diameter.
- The subject matter of your reverse design should be something memorable about Cupertino, cultural significance, or historical in nature. Repeat or similar designs of past medal will not be accepted. Your design may be in the form of a single photo, postcard, or group of drawings in one design. Not all members of our club are artists, so the subject matter may consist of cutout pictures and the like. The better the artwork, the better the design will work with our minter.
- You may submit an explanation of your design.
- You may submit a maximum of two designs.
- The designer's name or initials may not appear on the design or design explanation.
 Initials will be added after the winning design is selected.
- If your entry is of a private, commercial, trademarked, or copyrighted subject matter, then you must obtain written permission from the rights holder. If permission is not granted, then the runner-up design will be used.
- The following information must be included on the design: "52nd Coin Show" and "St. Joseph of Cupertino Church". Because we don't yet know the date of our 2026 show please insert just the year 2026 into your design. We reserve the right to add the full date of the 2026 show once it has been



decided upon and confirmed with the location.

- All entries may be submitted at a general club meeting or mailed to the club at: CCC Medal Design, P.O. Box 448, Cupertino, CA 95015-0448.
- All entries must be delivered to Medals Chair Emile M. by 8:00 p.m. at our August 8, 2025 meeting or arrive at our club's PO Box by August 1, 2025. The entries will be voted upon by our membership at our August 8, 2025 general meeting.
- In the event of identical design submissions, the first design submitted will be entered in the design contest.
- The winning design becomes the property of the Cupertino Coin Club and will not be returned. All other entries will be returned. The Cupertino Coin Club Board of Directors reserves the right to modify the winning design to meet the requirements of the minting process. Any modifications will be cleared with the designer.
- The winning designer shall receive one copper medal of their design as the winner's prize.

- The advertiser must submit ads by the last Friday of the month for inclusion in the next issue. If they are not submitted by then, they will not be included in that issue and instead will be postponed to the next issue.

 All payments must be made in advance to the treasurer unless special arrangements are made.
