

Quiz: Bullion Coins

 What three animals, whose names all start with "K", are featured on Australian bullion coins?

- Apart from their designs, what is the major difference between the \$50 American Gold Eagle and Gold Buffalo (below) bullion coins?
- What do you call the intrinsic price of a precious metal, set by international markets? What do you call the difference between the sellprice and the buy-price of a precious metal (or other commodity)?
- What countries produce the following bullion coins? Britannia, Dragon, Kiwi, Krugerrand, Libertad, Maple Leaf, Panda, Philharmonic?
- Which contains more gold: an American Gold Eagle or a pre-1933 double eagle?
- In English, we pronounce bullion and bouillon the same way. The latter term comes from French and means a broth. They originate from the same Latin root, the verb bullire. What does bullire mean?

Long-time Cupertino Coin Club member Harold James Woron died on August 16, 2025, at 89 years old. Harold was very involved in our Club, serving as a Board director and Show & Tell chair for many years.

Harold was born on 6 March, 1936 in Seattle, Washington. Harold received a B.A. in sociology from the University Of Washington In Seattle. Later, he received a B.S. and O.D. in Optometry at U.C. Berkeley. Harold moved to San Jose in 1973, running an optometry office in Mountain View.

Harold married in 1962, and had three children. At the time of his passing, he had three grandchildren and one greatgrandchild. Before marriage, he served as an artillery officer and 2nd lieutenant in the U.S. Army.

Besides his interest in numismatics, we learned of Harold's passion for collecting antique National Geographic maps during our annual "other hobbies nights."

We will remember Harold in our club as a dedicated board member and frequent volunteer. We will all miss his ready smile and kind demeanor.

- 4. They both feature people who were living at the time of minting. Then-Governor Thomas Kilby (1921 Alabama Centennial) and U.S. President Calvin Coolidge (1926 U.S. Sesquicentennial).
- 5. George Washington 250th Anniversary of Birth
- 6. Dwight Eisenhower (as General and President, facing different directions) in the Eisenhower Centennial dollar
