## The Newest America the Beautiful Quarter

The newest America the Beautiful Quarter was released on Monday. It is of the Ozark National Scenic Riverways in Missouri. This is the third quarter released in 2017, and this marks the 38th quarter in the America the Beautiful series.

Ozark National Scenic Riverways is the first National Park to protect a river system and is comprised of the Current and Jacks Forks Rivers. The park is a favorite for canoeing, swimming, boating, and fishing. The park also has freshwater springs, caves, trails and historic sites like the Alley Mill.

The Mill is depicted on the reverse of the quarter. It is a steel roller mill built in 1894 and was used to convert wheat into flour.
