BSA Coin Collecting Workshop a Success!

On Saturday, September 22, 2018, four board members of Cupertino Coin Club (Emile M., Suzy Tr., Alex Tr., and Al Lo), joined by a member of the Diablo Numismatic Society (Kyle A.) ran a successful Boy Scouts of America (BSA) Coin Collecting Merit Badge Workshop at CoinExpo at the Santa Clara Convention Center. Scott Griffin graciously provided the table on the bourse to run the workshop, and publicity of the workshop on his website, GriffinCoin.com. The workshop was attended by eight Boy Scouts interested in earning this elective merit badge and learning about coin collecting. The Scouts needed to prepare for the workshop ahead of time by doing some prerequisites which included reading the BSA Coin Collecting merit badge pamphlet and collecting coins out of circulation for four of the 10 requirements. 
